
Past-PLP Kiosk/Repository



Ella is doing a PLP on cooking but isnt sure how to make a rubric for that kind of project




Ella goes to the PLP kiosk in the PLP room and searches for a project that is similar to her




Ella finds a project from 2 Ell years ago about baking a cake and learns how that student

put together a grading rubric




Ella uses what she learned to create her own rubric.

Students are eager for feedback, but there is only so much a teacher can do




The student pings the teacher so they know they need support and the type of support they need so the educator can plan out how to

help the students




The teachers can come to them and help the struggling students with the problems.




The teachers can turn off the light if the problem is resolved.


Daily Progress Reminder

A daily bell goes off in the PLP room that reminds Danny that it's time to update his Headrush account with the progress he made today




All the students pull out their phones to update their progress in Headrush




Now the students are in the habit of updating their progress and the daily bell creates a sense of comradery among the students.


Personalized Monitering App




Ms. Samantha is an advisor for a wide range of student PLPs



Because the PLPs are all very different and are at different progress stages Ms. Samantha has a hard time keeping them organized in her head




Before PLP starts she opens an app that has information on all the student's projects including the topic, their progress, and any notes she has taken




During PLP time when Danny comes to ask for help, she can quickly pull up the information on that project and get up to speed in order to help Danny.


Small Group Collaboration

She put together a recommendation of student groups for collaboration based on similar topics or similar stages of progress



Ms. Samantha check in with the groups of students, where students each talks about how they are doing with their projects, and what challenges they're running. Ms. Samantha is able to give feedback more easily

Teacher has a lot of student PLPs to keep track of and has a hard time keeping track




Some students are good about reporting their progress, and others are not
